




## Course details

### Introduction



This course is designed to provide an insightful background knowledge to legionella for persons involved in controlling the risk of exposure to the bacteria in hot and cold water systems. Over two sessions the course will cover:

### Key learning areas:

- + Background: History, microbiology and what is legionella / legionellosis
- + Legal responsibilities:
  - + Applicable legislation
  - + HSE Approved Code of Practice L8
  - + HSE Technical Guidance HSG 274 parts 2 and 3
- + Compliance requirements:
  - + Legionella risk assessment
  - + Written control scheme
  - + Training and competence of staff and contractors
- + Controlling the risks within hot and cold water systems
- + Record keeping
- + Reviews

### Who should attend?

The course is intended for those who have a responsibility for implementing legionella control precautions and keeping records. Typically this will include premises managers and maintenance personnel.

### Delivery

The course is presented online by our associate legionella specialist Beverley Glasby. Beverley is an experienced health and safety professional who specialises in legionella control. She has hands on experience of undertaking risk assessments of hot and cold water systems, assessing and reviewing legionella control schemes and auditing legionella service providers. Her passion for the subject makes for an enjoyable and interesting training event. The duration of the course is four hours, broken into two 2 hour sessions with a break between.

### Delegate requirements

To attend the on-line sessions, delegates will need a computer, laptop or tablet with a working camera and microphone. Delegates are advised to test their connection before joining. Course notes and joining instructions will be provided to each delegate by email a minimum of 5 working days before the course.

### Delegates are required to ensure that:

- + They can enable the camera and audio from the device they are using
- + They take part in the training in a quiet area with table space
- + They have their pre-course material with them
- + They join each session five minutes before the start time

### Assessment

At the end of the course each delegate will receive a link by email to a short open-book assessment comprising 20 questions. This will take approximately 30 minutes to complete and the pass mark is 75% (15 out of 20 questions). The cost of the course includes two attempts at the assessment.

All delegates who attend both sessions and successfully complete the assessment will be issued with a certificate of training.

### Cost

The course cost is £595.00 for 6 delegates.

The cost for each additional delegate to a maximum of 12 is £40.00 (all costs exclude VAT). The cost includes all course materials, assessment and certification.
